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Dementia



Bexley CCG will

- Work collaboratively with people with dementia and carers
- Focus on providing more opportunities for residents to receive care and support at home.
- Develop an integrated care pathway for dementia that is part of the General Practices performance framework.
- Increase screening for over 65 years within General Practices
- Develop a local Dementia Outcomes Framework
- Increase public awareness of dementia and how it affects individuals.



Bexley CCG will

- Ensure patients are involved in the development of new services.
- Improve early diagnose and early interventions e.g. memory clinics.
- Develop a plan to deliver a dementia training framework.
- Develop a programme to improve dementia care in acute hospital, residential and nursing care homes.
- Review palliative and end of life care arrangements and plan seamless services for dementia patients and their carers.



How do we know that we have succeeded?

By 2015 we will:-

- have provided sound advice and information to help people with dementia and their carers receive support and understand dementia care pathways.
- have developed new models of care to promote early intervention to support people with dementia to live at home.
- have improved acute hospital dementia care.
- see improvements dementia care in residential and nursing settings.



In addition:-

- Early diagnosis in primary care will have improved.
- People with dementia and their carers will be contributing in the design of services.
