What is a Governor?

- Governors are people interested in Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust and the services we provide.
- Governors are people who use our services or care for someone who uses them.
- Governors are people who live in England.
- Governors are members of Oxleas.
- Members vote to choose governors.



Can I be a Governor?

If you can answer 'Yes' to the following, you can put yourself forward to be a Governor.



- I am an Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust member.
- I am aged 16 years or over.
- I am able to be a Governor for the next three years.
- I will attend a meeting to learn what a Governor does.
- I will take part in training.
- I will attend Council of Governors meetings four times a year.
- I may have to read lots of information but will ask for help if I need it.
- I will ask questions at meetings.
- I am able to listen to everyone's ideas whether I agree or not.
- I enjoy meeting and helping people.





How can I become a Governor?

- We will tell you when you can apply to be a Governor.
- You can then put yourself forward as a Governor.
- If more than one person puts themselves forward, the members in your group will vote to choose which person they would like to be their Governor.
